1. The RFP calls for a custom-built solution, however we have an off the shelf solution, OpenCaseware, which can do everything outlined in the RFP with some custom configuration and integration. This would be a substantial cost savings to the State. Are you receptive to a SAAS solution, or do you require 100% custom code?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are open to packaged or ‘shell’ software packages that could be customized to the State’s needs, but we are not interested in a solution that is hosted off-site.
2. Our solution is neither .NET based nor does it use Microsoft SQL, are these firm requirements?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yes
3. Are you open to a cloud-hosted solution?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No
4. Approximately how many users and of which roles would use the system?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 Administrative Users • 250 Potential Self Service Users
5. For this RFP, there is a requirement for an ACH file to be generated and transmitted to the "bank". Would you mind telling me which bank y'all use, and the method preferred to transfer this file via the "interface" defined in section 2.4.1 ?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The ACH file must be developed in the industry standard NACHA format and will be transmitted via secure FTP to the bank. Since these are standard file formats and transfer protocols, the bank name is not relevant.
6. Have you considered having your IT department install CONCUR? I believe that it meets your needs.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are open to packaged or ‘shell’ software packages that could be customized to the State’s needs, but we are not interested in a solution that is hosted off-site.
7. Section 2.5 describes the target technical environment. Is it possible to add additional components to this target environment that are technically compatible? Specifically, in addition to the native Microsoft web server (IIS 2012), can we also utilize Apache TomCat server running on a Windows Server?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No. We do not need another hosting system.
8. Is there any location restriction for resources working on this project?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • GGA would like to have an on-site presence for requirements gathering, testing and cut-over support. • Development activities can be conducted off-site by remote resources located in the United States.
9. Would the Fiscal Office provide a demo of the existing system to prospective bidders?	We are unable to provide a demonstration, please see Appendix A of the RFP for

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	documentation of the current systems and business processes.
10. The RFP requires that the proposed solution support IE v 8 and up. Since IE8 is no longer supported by Microsoft, supporting its use is a severe security risk. Would the Fiscal Office consider supporting only currently supported versions of IE?	Yes. Currently supported versions are fine. In fact, Edge will become our default this summer.
11. Please provide the anticipated number of total users and number of maximum concurrent users for the proposed application	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 Administrative Users • 250 Potential Self Service Users with a max of 50 concurrent users

GGA has a separate mobile device network that users would

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	connect through via HTTPS through the firewall. There will be no access through the public internet.

Fiscal Office - Group that processes payments. 2. Members - Group that submits payment requests. 3. Approvers - Group that approves transactions. 4. Administrator – Fiscal office staff who configures system and updates tables for each Legislative Session.

19. Will the application be deployed to the existing infrastructure?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yes

35. From the requirements in section 2.4, it seems that all integration is outbound (from LMSS to other systems) and is done through files (not API calls). Can you confirm that?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yes – all integration is outbound and done through flat files.
36. In section 6.4, it indicates that the cost proposal will account for 300 points and the technical proposal will account for 700 points. If there is a	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The offeror presentations will add or subtract points from the technical proposal scoring.

Does the new system need to allow an administrator to update this data mid-session? For example, could committee membership change mid-session? a. If data changes are allowed mid-session, does a change log need to be maintained for these changes?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The current system has the ability to add and change committee membership during the session. The same functionality should be provided. • Yes, a change log should be maintained.
<p>38. Is the system required to print live checks?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yes
<p>39. What system are vouchers sent to?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The State of Georgia’s PeopleSoft Financial System (which is known as TeamWorks) managed by the State Accounting Office.
<p>40. What is the definition of pilot for this system? Are there basic requirements that would need to be met for a pilot? Who are the pilot users and how many?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will define the pilot with the selected vendor. The strategy is to select a few committees and members who would pilot the on-line roster and expense report functionality.
<p>41. Is the system required to be able to manually enter in attendance affidavits? Is there a system that can be integrated to handle the attendance roll calls?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yes, attendance will have to be entered into the new system as there is no existing system that handles this information. Today, the information is manually entered LMSS by the Fiscal Office Staff. We are looking to have this information entered by the clerks during the sessions / meetings.
<p>42. Are there GGA standards around user experience and/or graphical design? If yes, can that be shared?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are no current standards. It is possible that the GUI for this project may become the standard for future development projects.
<p>43. When does the contract start date begin / end? Is it tied to fiscal calendars or is it simply 2 years from the start date</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two years from the start date.
<p>44. What version of .net does GGA currently have and intend to support?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Microsoft .NET platform consists of MS SQL Server 2012 and IIS 2012.
<p>45. What is the approved budget range?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are not providing this information.

Is there anything that shows the requirements for the PeopleSoft Financials and HCM System integrations?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Information about the PeopleSoft Journal Upload process can be found at the following location: https://sao.georgia.gov/spreadsheet-upload-template • The HCM Interface is produced out of the current system and contains payroll tax withholding deductions for W2 reporting.
