Blake A. Travis has served the General Assembly of Georgia through the Office of Legislative Counsel since 2014. Mr. Travis became a member of the State Bar of Georgia after earning a Juris Doctor from the University of Georgia School of Law and a Bachelor of Arts from Wake Forest University. While practicing law, he earned a Master of Public Administration from Georgia State University, focusing in the areas of management and finance. He is also a licensed mediator for both general civil and domestic relations cases and has mediated more than 50 cases.

Prior to joining the legislative branch, Mr. Travis served Georgia's executive branch as Staff Attorney for the judges of the Office of State Administrative Hearings. While there, he maintained a docket as a mediator, conducted prehearing conferences, and drafted decisions for a myriad of administrative case types, including those related to elections, health, public assistance, driver's and professional license suspensions, tax, and child support establishment and enforcement.

Immediately prior to joining the Office of Legislative Counsel, Mr. Travis acquired litigation and appellate experience as Assistant Regional Counsel for the National Association of Government Employees. From a pool of more than 4,000 employees from a variety of occupations, he primarily represented members of the International Brotherhood of Police Officers in appeals of adverse actions related to employment and licensure. He also remained on call for, and reported to the scene of, officer involved shootings and represented those officers in their attendant criminal statements.
