## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending the National Conference of State Legislatures; and for other

2 purposes.

WHEREAS, the National Conference of State Legislatures was founded in 1975 and has
evolved during the past quarter century to become the preeminent organization dedicated
to serving state lawmakers and staff; and

6 WHEREAS, it was created from the merger of three organizations that served or represented
7 state legislatures and that shared the belief that legislative service is one of democracy's
8 worthiest pursuits; and

9 WHEREAS, NCSL is a bipartisan organization and with three objectives: to improve the 10 quality and effectiveness of state legislatures; to foster interstate communication and 11 cooperation; and to ensure states a strong, cohesive voice in the federal system; and

WHEREAS, our nation's state legislatures are the forum where the ideas of America are crafted, debated, and enacted, and NCSL has facilitated the exchange of ideas, provided critical research and information, and encouraged a rigorous review of the complex issues confronting our communities, states, and nation.
