A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, known as the
- 2 "Dead Animal Disposal Act," so as to change the definition of dead animals that are subject
- 3 to such chapter; to prohibit certain conduct; to change the provisions relating to the disposal
- 4 of dead animals and the requirement related thereto; to regulate the hauling or transportation
- 5 of dead animals; to provide for permits; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 5 of Title 4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, known as the "Dead Animal
- 9 Disposal Act," is amended by striking Code Section 4-5-2, relating to the definition of the
- 10 term "dead animals," and inserting in its place the following:
- 11 "4-5-2.
- As used in this chapter, the term -dead animals' means the carcasses, parts of carcasses,
- 13 <u>fetuses, embryos</u>, effluent, or blood of farm livestock, including, without limitation, cattle,
- swine, sheep, goats, poultry, ratites, and equines equine, and alternative livestock, and pet
- animals associated with pet dealers, kennels, animal shelters, and bird dealers licensed by
- the Georgia Department of Agriculture."
- 17 SECTION 2.
- 18 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 4-5-3, relating to abandonment of
- 19 dead animals and requirements for disposal, and inserting in its place the following:
- 20 "4-5-3.
- 21 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person who owns or is caring for an animal which has died
- or has been killed to abandon the <u>dead</u> animal, its parts, or blood. Such person shall dispose
- of the dead animal as provided for in this chapter or in rules and regulations adopted
- pursuant to this chapter. Under no conditions may dead animals be abandoned in wells, or
- open pits, or surface waters of any kind on private or public land.

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1 (b) No person shall dispose of an <u>a dead</u> animal, its parts, or blood by burial or burning on

- 2 the land of another without the permission of the owner of the land.
- 3 (c) Arrangements for proper burial or burning must be made with a city or county official
- 4 in order to dispose of a dead animal in a city or county dump <u>landfill</u>."

5 SECTION 3.

- 6 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 4-5-5, relating to methods of
- 7 disposal of dead animals, and inserting in its place the following:
- 8 "4-5-5.
- 9 Methods which can be used for disposal of dead animals are burning, incineration, burial,
- rendering, or any method using appropriate disposal technology which has been approved
- by the Commissioner of Agriculture. Disposal of animal carcasses dead animals by any of
- the approved methods must be completed within 12 hours after death or discovery of the
- carcass. <u>Dead animals that</u> Carcasses which are buried must be buried at least three feet
- below the ground level, and have not less than three feet of earth over the carcass, and must
- not contaminate ground water or surface water."

SECTION 4.

- 17 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 4-5-7, relating to disposal of
- 18 carcasses and waste material by livestock sales markets and livestock slaughter
- 19 establishments, and inserting in its place the following:
- 20 "4-5-7.
- 21 (a) Public livestock sales markets, and livestock slaughter establishments, poultry dealers,
- 22 poultry sales establishments, pet dealers, kennels, bird dealers, animal shelters, and stables
- 23 <u>licensed by the Georgia Department of Agriculture</u> shall have a written, an approved
- 24 method and place for the disposal of all <u>dead animals</u> portions of any carcass, including
- 25 blood, effluent, and all accessory waste material involved in the handling of the carcasses
- of <u>dead</u> animals which die on or within the premises of such establishments.
- 27 (b) Deer processing facilities and wildlife exhibitors under the authority of the Georgia
- 28 <u>Department of Natural Resources must dispose of all dead deer and wildlife, including</u>
- 29 <u>carcasses, parts of carcasses, fetuses, embryos, effluent, blood, and all accessory waste</u>
- 30 <u>material involved in the handling of such dead animals, in accordance with the methods</u>
- 31 <u>outlined in Code Section 4-5-5.</u>
- 32 (c) The Commissioner of Agriculture shall approve the methods and places for disposal of
- 33 <u>such dead animals and may establish procedures, methods, and permits for disposal of dead</u>
- 34 <u>animals for animal feeding operations, deer processing facilities, and wildlife exhibitors."</u>

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SECTION 5.

- 2 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 4-5-9, relating to the prohibition
- 3 of transportation of dead animals, effluent, or parts thereof, and inserting in its place the
- 4 following:
- 5 "4-5-9.
- 6 The Commissioner of Agriculture may prohibit or restrict, at his or her discretion, and issue
- 7 <u>permits for the hauling or transportation of dead animals or types of dead animals the body,</u>
- 8 effluent, or parts of any dead animals and order the destruction thereof in accordance with
- 9 this chapter."

10 SECTION 6.

- 11 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 4-5-10, relating to promulgation
- 12 of rules and regulations, and inserting in its place the following:
- 13 "4-5-10.
- 14 The Commissioner of Agriculture is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations to
- implement and accomplish the purposes of this chapter."

16 **SECTION 7.**

17 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
