A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the nineteenth day of June of each year as "Juneteenth Celebration Day" in
- 2 Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the Emancipation Proclamation became effective on January 1, 1863, and
- 4 General Lee surrendered in April, 1865, officially ending the Civil War; and
- 5 WHEREAS, news of the Emancipation Proclamation and the end of the Civil War did not
- 6 reach Texas until June 19, 1865, when Major General Gordon Granger landed at Galveston,
- 7 Texas; and
- 8 WHEREAS, on that evening, thousands of former slaves flooded the streets of Galveston,
- 9 rejoicing in the news of their freedom; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the nineteenth day of June has been celebrated as "Juneteenth" to commemorate
- the events of June 19,1865, and celebrations have occurred in at least 43 states; and
- 12 WHEREAS, "Juneteenth" has been designated as a state holiday in Texas and Oklahoma.
- 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 GEORGIA that the nineteenth day of June in each year shall be designated as "Juneteenth
- 15 Celebration Day" in Georgia to commemorate the events of June 19, 1865.
- 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that citizens of Georgia are encouraged to observe the
- 17 nineteenth of June as "Juneteenth Celebration Day" with appropriate programs and
- 18 celebrations.
- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to interested organizations and
- 21 to the owners or operators of newspapers, magazines, radio stations, and television stations.
