A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and
- 2 traffic, so as to regulate the use of electric personal assistive mobility devices; to define
- 3 certain terms; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 SECTION 1.

- 6 Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is
- 7 amended in Code section 40-1-1, relating to definitions, by inserting a new paragraph (15.6)
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 "(15.6) 'Electric personal assistive mobility device' or 'EPAMD' means a self-balancing,
- two nontandem wheeled device designed to transport only one person and having an
- electric propulsion system with average power of 750 watts (1 horsepower) and a
- maximum speed of less than 20 miles per hour on a paved level surface when powered
- solely by such propulsion system and ridden by an operator who weighs 170 pounds."
- 14 SECTION 2.
- 15 Said title is further amended in said Code Section 40-1-1 by striking paragraph (33) and
- 16 inserting in lieu thereof the following:
- 17 "(33) 'Motor vehicle' means every vehicle which is self-propelled, other than an electric
- personal assistive mobility device (EPAMD)."
- 19 SECTION 3.
- 20 Said title is further amended in Article 13 of Chapter 6, relating to special provisions for
- 21 certain vehicles, by adding a new Part 5 to read as follows:

- 2 40-6-360.
- 3 (a) Electric personal assistive mobility devices may be operated on sidewalks, bikepaths,
- 4 and highways, provided that any person operating such a device shall have the same rights
- 5 and duties as prescribed for pedestrians in Article 5 of this chapter and except as otherwise
- 6 provided in this part.
- 7 (b) No person shall operate any electric personal assistive mobility device on the roadway
- 8 of any highway except where the maximum speed limit is 15 mph or less.
- 9 40-6-361.
- 10 Any person operating an electric personal assistive mobility device on a sidewalk or
- 11 roadway shall exercise due care to avoid colliding with, and shall yield the right of way to,
- 12 persons traveling on foot.
- 13 40-6-362.
- 14 No person shall operate an electric personal assistive mobility device at a speed greater
- than 15 miles per hour.
- 16 40-6-363.
- 17 (a) An electric personal assistive mobility device may be parked on a sidewalk unless
- otherwise prohibited or restricted by an official traffic control device.
- 19 (b) An electric personal assistive mobility device shall not be parked on any roadway in
- such a manner as to prevent the movement of a legally parked motor vehicle.
- 21 (c) Except as otherwise provided in this Code section, any person operating an electric
- 22 personal assistive mobility device shall be subject to the same parking restrictions as
- provided for motor vehicles under Part 1 of Article 10 of this chapter. All violations of
- parking restrictions shall be deemed the responsibility of the owner of such device; and,
- 25 for purposes of parking restrictions, the owner shall be deemed to be in control of the
- device at the time of a parking violation involving such device, and no evidence of actual
- 27 control by such owner need be proven as an element of the offense.

- No person shall carry or transport any hazardous materials on an electric personal assistive
- 30 mobility device.

- 1 40-6-365.
- 2 Any electric personal assistive mobility device, when operated on any highway, sidewalk,
- 3 or bikepath, shall be equipped with front, rear, and side reflectors which shall be visible
- 4 from a distance of 300 feet when directly in front of lawful upper beams of headlights on
- a motor vehicle; a system that when employed will enable the operator to bring the device
- 6 to a controlled stop; and, if the device is operated between one-half hour after sunset and
- 7 one-half hour before sunrise, a lamp emitting a white light which, while the device is in
- 8 motion, illuminates the area in front of the operator for a distance of 300 feet."

9 **SECTION 4.**

- 10 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 11 without such approval.

12 SECTION 5.

13 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
