A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 7, 2002, as Girl Scout Day in Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting was begun in Savannah, Georgia, on March 1912, by Juliette
3 Gordon Low; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the purpose of Girl Scouting is to inspire girls with the highest ideals of
5 character, conduct, patriotism, and service that they may become happy and resourceful
6 citizens; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting is the world's preeminent organization dedicated solely to girls
8 and has more than three million members across the United States and around the world; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting does not discriminate and is committed to reflecting the racial
10 and ethnic diversity of the United States; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting is represented in all of the 159 counties in Georgia by the eight
12 Girl Scout Councils which offer to serve "Every Girl Everywhere"; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the Girl Scouting movement is celebrating the 90th Anniversary of its founding
14 in 2002.
- 15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
16 the members of this body recognize February 7, 2002, as Girl Scout Day in Georgia and
17 commend and congratulate all the girls and women in Georgia who participate in girl
18 scouting.
- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
20 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the public and the press.
