A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Mary T. Scott; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, Mary T. Scott is well known in Reidsville, Georgia, where this wonderful
3 native of Tattnall County has contributed substantially to the quality of life of her fellow
4 citizens and their families as a very dedicated and valued officer of The Tattnall Bank; and

5 WHEREAS, Mary Sue Thigpen began her employment at the Bank on January 15, 1952, as
6 a bookkeeper; married Hugh E. Scott also a county native in 1958; and quickly mastered the

13 named Senior Vice President and Head of Operations, in recognition of her keen
14 understanding, effective management, prudence, integrity, and personable manner; and

15 WHEREAS, in addition to her demanding professional duties, she has been involved in many
16 civic and charitable organizations, including the Reidsville Baptist Church where she was
17 Assistant Treasurer 1977-1992 and Church Treasurer for the past ten years; and she has
18 additionally served as a director and treasurer of the Tattnall County Chamber of Commerce.
