

## House Resolution 1074

## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Joint Local Assistance Road Program Study Committee; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, increased funding of the local assistance road program is crucial to the  
3 continued economic development of this state; and

4 WHEREAS, there is a need to review such laws relating to that program and the manner of  
5 its funding to determine whether any reform, revision, or modernization of such laws is  
6 necessary and appropriate under current economic conditions so as to better fulfill the  
7 purposes of such laws.

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
9 GEORGIA that there is created the Joint Local Assistance Road Program Study Committee  
10 to be composed of four members of the Senate, two members of county governing  
11 authorities, and one member of a municipal governing authority to be appointed by the  
12 President of the Senate and four members of the House of Representatives, two members of  
13 county governing authorities, and one member of a municipal governing authority to be  
14 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The President of the Senate and  
15 the Speaker of the House shall each designate a member of the committee as cochairperson  
16 of the committee. The cochairpersons shall call all meetings of the committee.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions,  
18 needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any actions  
19 or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may  
20 conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or  
21 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and  
22 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The legislative members of the  
23 committee shall receive the allowances authorized for legislative members of interim  
24 legislative committees but shall receive the same for not more than three days unless  
25 additional days are authorized by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House

1 of Representatives. The nonlegislative members shall serve without compensation. The  
2 funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from the funds  
3 appropriated to the Senate and to the House of Representatives. In the event the committee  
4 makes a report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed  
5 legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before December 31, 2002. The  
6 committee shall stand abolished on December 31, 2002.
