A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., which was founded at Howard University
3 in Washington, D.C. in 1908, has the distinction of being the first sorority established by
4 African American college women and has become an international organization with 850
5 chapters; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Georgia hosts 50 of these undergraduate and graduate chapters located on
7 college and university campuses and in communities throughout the state; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., is committed to community service and
9 actively contributes to the educational, civic, and social life of Georgia's citizens; and
- 10 WHEREAS, AKA Day at the Capitol is a national program in which members of Alpha
11 Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., throughout the country meet with their legislators to address
12 issues that are pertinent to their communities; and
- 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
14 declare February 19, 2001, as AKA Day at the Capitol and commend the members of Alpha
15 Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., for their community service and extend to them their best
16 wishes.

18 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to Sonja Garcia and Marjorie H. Young,
