

The Senate Insurance and Labor Committee offers the following substitute to HB 1100:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to general provisions regarding insurance generally, so as to require health benefit
3 policy coverage for colorectal cancer screening; to provide for definitions; to provide for
4 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

6 Article 1 of Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
7 general provisions regarding insurance generally, is amended by adding after Code Section
8 33-24-56.2 a new Code section to read as follows:

10 "33-24-56.3.

11 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:

12 (1) 'Health benefit policy' means any individual or group plan, policy, or contract for
13 health care services issued, delivered, issued for delivery, executed, or renewed by an
14 insurer in this state on or after July 1, 2002, including, but not limited to, those contracts
15 executed by the Department of Community Health pursuant to paragraph (1) of
16 subsection (f) of Code Section 31-5A-4. The term 'health benefit policy' does not include
17 the following limited benefit insurance policies: accident only, CHAMPUS supplement,
18 dental, disability income, fixed indemnity, long-term care, medicare supplement,
19 specified disease, vision, and nonrenewable individual policies written for a period of less
20 than six months.

21 (2) 'Insurer' means any person, corporation, or other entity authorized to provide health
22 benefit policies under this title.

23 (b) Every health benefit policy shall provide coverage for colorectal cancer screening,
24 examinations, and laboratory tests in accordance with the most recently published
25 guidelines and recommendations established by the American Cancer Society, in
26 consultation with the American College of Gastroenterology and the American College of

1 Radiology, for the ages, family histories, and frequencies referenced in such guidelines and
2 recommendations and deemed appropriate by the attending physician after conferring with
3 the patient.

4 (c) The benefits provided in this Code section shall be subject to the same annual
5 deductibles or coinsurance established for all other covered benefits within a given health
6 benefit policy."

7 **SECTION 2.**

8 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
