## A RESOLUTION

1 Commemorating the founding of the Girl Scout movement in the United States by Georgian  
2 Juliette Gordon Low and recognizing Troop 68 of McDonough, Georgia, whose members  
3 are serving as pages; and for other purposes.

4 WHEREAS, Juliette Gordon Low was born in Savannah on October 31, 1860, and founded  
5 on March 12, 1912, the first troop of Girl Scouts as an organization dedicated to training  
6 young women for better citizenship and responsible adulthood; and

7 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting has now spread throughout the United States and many foreign  
8 countries and today it is the world's largest organization devoted solely to girls and develops  
9 leadership skills, strong values, and a social conscience that serves them all their lives; and

10 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts typically celebrate Founders Day by scheduling a series of events  
11 that demonstrate their ideals during the week of March 12th; and

12 WHEREAS, in honor of the 90th birthday of Girl Scouts, the members of Troop 68 from  
13 McDonough, Georgia, and the Pine Valley Girl Scout Council are serving as legislative  
14 pages for the Georgia General Assembly and their presence is greatly appreciated.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
16 the members of this body recognize the 90th anniversary of the founding of Girl Scouts and  
17 commends Troop 68 from McDonough, Georgia, for serving as pages on Founders Day.

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
19 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Karen Ingram.
