A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging congressional support for the Railroad Retirement and Survivors Improvement Act;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the Railroad Retirement and Survivors Improvement Act of 2000 was approved
- 4 in a bipartisan effort by 391 members of the United States House of Representatives in the
- 5 106th Congress; and
- 6 WHEREAS, more than 80 United States Senators, including Georgia Senators Max Cleland
- 7 and Zell Miller, signed letters of support for this legislation in 2000; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the bill currently before the 107th Congress modernizes the railroad retirement 9 system for its 748,000 beneficiaries nationwide, including over 16,900 in Georgia; and
- 10 WHEREAS, railroad management, labor, and retiree organizations have agreed to support
- 11 this legislation which provides tax relief to freight railroad, Amtrak, and commuter lines; and
- 12 WHEREAS, this legislation provides improved benefits for surviving spouses of rail workers
- 13 who currently suffer deep cuts in income when the rail retiree dies; and
- 14 WHEREAS, no outside contributions from taxpayers are needed to implement the changes 15 called for in this legislation since all changes are paid from within the railroad industry,
- 16 including a full share by active employees.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
 this body urges the support of the Railroad Retirement and Survivors Improvement Act in
 the 107th Congress.

- 1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 2 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to each member of Congress
- 3 from Georgia.
