AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1 To amend Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to health, so as to
2 authorize the Department of Community Health to award grants, as funds become available,
3 to certified rural hospitals for public health purposes; to provide for the Department of
4 Community Health to promulgate rules and regulations for effective administration of such
5 grants; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to health, is amended in
9 subsection (f) of Code Section 31-5A-4, relating to the department's powers, duties,
10 functions, and responsibilities, divisions, directors, the Office of Women's Health, and
11 contracts for health benefits, by striking the word "and" at the end of paragraph (6), by
12 striking the period at the end of paragraph (7) and inserting in lieu thereof the word and
13 symbol "; and", and by adding a new paragraph (8) to read as follows:

14 "(8) Is authorized to award grants, as funds are available, to hospital authorities and
15 hospitals for public health purposes, pursuant to Code Sections 31-7-94 and 31-7-94.1."

16 **SECTION 2.**

17 Said title is further amended by striking Code Section 31-7-94, relating to grants to hospital
18 authorities, and inserting in its place the following:

19 "31-7-94.

20 The state is authorized to make grants, as funds are available, to hospital authorities for
21 public health purposes, provided that any funds so granted shall be distributed to and
22 among the various public hospital authorities in the state in proportion to the number of
23 hospital beds operated by each such hospital authority at the end of the calendar year
24 preceding the grant. Funds shall be distributed to public hospitals operated by consolidated
25 governments in the same manner as to authority hospitals prescribed in this Code section.
26 Grants made by the state pursuant to this Code section shall be administered by the

1 Department of ~~Human Resources~~ Community Health in accordance with such rules,
2 regulations, and procedures as it shall deem necessary for effective administration of such
3 grants."

4 **SECTION 3.**

5 Said title is further amended by striking Code Section 31-7-94.1, relating to certification of
6 rural hospitals for grant eligibility and rules and regulations relative to the "Rural Hospital
7 Authorities Assistance Act," and inserting in its place the following:

8 "31-7-94.1.

9 (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Rural Hospital ~~Authorities~~
10 Assistance Act.'

11 (b) The General Assembly finds that hospital authorities are created under Code Section
12 31-7-72 in and for each county and municipal corporation of the state in order to promote
13 public health goals of the state. The General Assembly further finds that many hospitals
14 ~~owned or operated by hospital authorities~~ in rural counties, whether or not they are owned
15 or operated by hospital authorities, are in desperate financial straits. In order to preserve
16 the availability of primary health care services provided by such hospitals to residents of
17 rural counties, the General Assembly has determined that a program of state grants is
18 necessary and recommends funds be made available to such hospitals. These grants will
19 be conditioned upon those hospitals continuing to furnish essential health care services to
20 residents in their areas of operation as well as engaging in the long-range planning and any
21 restructuring which may be required for those hospitals to survive by devising
22 cost-effective and efficient health care systems for meeting local health care needs.

23 (c) As used in this Code section, the term:

24 (1) 'Department of Community Health' means the Department of Community Health
25 created under Chapter 5A of this title.

26 (2) 'Hospital' means an institution which has a permit as a hospital issued under this
27 chapter.

28 (3) 'Rural county' means a county having a population of less than 35,000 according to
29 the United States decennial census of 1990 or any future such census.

30 (4) 'Rural hospital' means a hospital ~~owned or operated by a hospital authority~~, which
31 ~~hospital~~ has been certified by the Department of Community Health as:

32 (A) Being located in a rural county;

33 (B) Participating in both Medicaid and medicare and accepting both Medicaid and
34 medicare patients;

35 (C) Providing health care services to indigent patients; and

1 (D) Maintaining a 24 hour emergency room.

2 (d) A rural hospital may apply for a grant available under subsection (e) of this Code
3 section if it has been certified by the Department of Community Health as:

4 (1) A rural hospital;

5 (2) Having submitted a grant application which includes:

6 (A) A problem statement indicating the problem the rural hospital proposes to solve
7 with the grant funds;

8 (B) The goals of the proposed solution;

9 (C) The organizational structure, financial system, and facilities that are essential to the
10 proposed solution;

11 (D) The projected longevity of the proposed solution after the grant funds are
12 expended;

13 (E) Evidence of collaboration with other community health care providers in achieving
14 the proposed solution;

15 (F) Evidence that funds for the proposed solution are not available from another
16 source;

17 (G) Evidence that the grant funds would assist in returning the hospital to an
18 economically stable condition or that any plan for closure or realignment of services
19 involves development of innovative alternatives for the discontinued services;

20 (H) Evidence of a satisfactory record-keeping system to account for grant fund
21 expenditures within the rural county;

22 (I) A community health survival plan describing how the plan was developed, the goals
23 of the plan, the links with existing health care providers under the plan, the
24 implementation process including quantification of indicators of the hospital's financial
25 well-being, measurable outcome targets, and the current condition of such hospital; and

26 (J) Such additional evidence as the Department of Community Health may require to
27 demonstrate the feasibility of the proposed solution for which grant funds are sought.

28 (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of Code Section 31-7-94, the ~~department~~ Department
29 of Community Health is authorized to make grants to rural hospitals certified as meeting
30 the requirements of subsection (d) of this Code section. ~~Such grants~~ Grants to rural
31 hospitals owned or operated by hospital authorities may be for any of the following
32 purposes:

33 (1) Infrastructure development, including, without being limited to, facility renovation
34 or equipment acquisition; provided, however, that the amount granted to any qualified
35 hospital may not exceed the expenditure thresholds that would constitute a new

1 institutional health service requiring a certificate of need under Chapter 6 of this title and
2 the grant award may be conditioned upon obtaining local matching funds;

3 (2) Strategic planning, including, without being limited to, strategies for personnel
4 retention or recruitment, development of an emergency medical network, or the
5 development of a collaborative and integrated health care delivery system with other
6 health care providers, and the grant award may be conditioned upon obtaining local
7 matching funds for items such as telemedicine, billing systems, and medical records. For
8 the purposes of this paragraph, the maximum grant to any grantee shall be \$200,000.00;

9 ~~or~~

10 (3) Nontraditional health care delivery systems, excluding operational funds and
11 purposes for which grants may be made under paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection. For
12 the purposes of this paragraph, the maximum grant to any grantee shall be \$1.5 million;

13 or

14 (4) The provision of health care services to indigent patients in the rural county.

15 Any grants to certified rural hospitals which are not owned or operated by hospital
16 authorities shall be limited to the purpose described in paragraph (4) of this Code section.

17 (f) In awarding grants under this Code section, the ~~department~~ Department of Community
18 Health may give priority to any otherwise eligible rural hospital which meets the definition
19 of a 'necessary provider' as specified in the state's 'Rural Healthcare Plan' of May, 1998.

20 (g) ~~The department shall adopt regulations to implement its powers and duties under this~~
21 ~~Code section.~~ The Department of Community Health shall be authorized to certify rural
22 hospitals as provided in subsection (d) of this Code section and shall adopt regulations to
23 implement its powers and duties under this Code section."

24 SECTION 4.

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
