A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the Longleaf Pine Capital of Georgia; and for other purposes.

- 2 WHEREAS, Baxley, Georgia, in Appling County is home to Moody Forest where the Nature
- 3 Conservancy recently purchased 3,500 acres of land bordering the Altamaha River, that land
- 4 being the only known example of old-growth longleaf pine and blackjack oak forest in North
- 5 America; and

6 WHEREAS, in the 1700's, longleaf pines covered more than 90 million acres across the
7 Southeast and, today, less than 3 percent of the original forest remains; and

8 WHEREAS, a longleaf pine can reach over 120 feet tall with a trunk exceeding 3 feet across,
9 and the longleaf pine has the longest needles (10-18") and the largest cones (6-10") of the

10 southern pines; and

WHEREAS, the longleaf pine ecosystem supports more than 300 rare, threatened, or endangered plant and animal species, and longleaf pine forests are more disease and fire-resistant and can be managed with prescribed burns to maintain a healthy, viable ecosystem.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
commend Baxley, Georgia, as the host of the Timber Harvesting Expo Southeast and the
Baxley Tree Fest and recognize Baxley and Appling County as the Longleaf Pine Capital of
Georgia.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Lynn Carter, Executive Director of
Baxley-Appling County Board of Tourism.
