## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Expressing regrets at the passing of Mollie Eileen Newton; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Mollie E. Newton is remembered by many members of this body as a former  
3 intern to the Majority Leader's Office in the 2000 Regular Session and as the very able  
4 assistant to the Georgia Pharmacy Association during later legislative sessions; and
- 5 WHEREAS, she grew up in Peachtree City, graduated from McIntosh High School in 1997,  
6 was majoring in economics at Georgia Institute of Technology where she was regularly on  
7 the dean's list for academic excellence, and was scheduled to graduate in December of 2001  
8 when she tragically lost her life in a car accident on May 16, 2001; and
- 9 WHEREAS, she was a valuable member of the Georgia Tech women's rowing team and was  
10 actively involved in the Campus Christian Fellowship organization as well as her home  
11 church, Providence United Methodist Church of Fayetteville; and
- 12 WHEREAS, her fine academic record, eagerness to explore new experiences, compassion  
13 for those less fortunate, and steadfast optimism were admired by all who knew her.
- 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
15 the members of this body express regret at the tragic loss of Mollie Eileen Newton, a young  
16 woman of great promise and achievement, and convey their sympathy to her beloved family.
- 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
18 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the family of Mollie Eileen  
19 Newton.
