A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Laurie Murrah; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, 4-H Clubs of Georgia provide a unique educational opportunity for students
3 from nine to 19 years of age to learn valuable lessons outside the classroom and offer some
4 55 project areas in which students can develop expertise and compete with one another; and

5 WHEREAS, Georgia's 4-H programs are coordinated by the Cooperative Extension Service
6 of the University of Georgia College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, and this
7 service is the major university outreach program focusing on the youth of this state; and

9 recipient of a prestigious 2000 National 4-H Award as a winner in the Wildlife Judging Team
10 Event, which was held in Townsend, Tennessee; and

12 state has in its young people.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
14 recognize and commend Laurie Murrah as the recipient of the prestigious 1999 National 4-H
15 Award in the Wildlife Judging Team Event and for her outstanding dedication to the
16 principles of 4-H programs.
