AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide for the nonpartisan nomination and election of the chief magistrate of Meriwether
- 2 County; to provide for the requirements and procedures of the nonpartisan nomination and
- 3 election; to provide for other matters relative to the foregoing; to provide for the authority
- 4 for this Act; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 The chief magistrate of Meriwether County shall be elected by the qualified voters of
- 8 Meriwether County in a nonpartisan primary and election. Except as otherwise provided in
- 9 this Act, the chief magistrate shall be elected pursuant to the general elections laws of
- 10 Georgia.

11 SECTION 2.

- 12 Beginning with the election held in 2004 and every four years thereafter, the chief magistrate
- shall be elected at the nonpartisan primary and general election immediately preceding the
- expiration of the term of office of the chief magistrate and shall take office on January 1
- 15 immediately following such election for a term of four years and until such judge's successor
- is elected and qualified.

17 SECTION 3.

- 18 Candidates for the office of chief magistrate shall be nominated in a nonpartisan primary to
- 19 be held at the same time as and in conjunction with the general primary every four years. A
- 20 nominating petition shall not be required to place the name of any such candidate on the
- 21 primary ballot. A candidate may have his or her name placed on the primary ballot by filing
- 22 a notice of candidacy with the county election superintendent and by paying the qualifying
- 23 fee.

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SECTION 4.

2 The candidate receiving a majority of votes in the nonpartisan primary shall be the nominee

- 3 for the office of chief magistrate and shall be the only candidate for such office to have his
- 4 or her name appear on the general election ballot. In the event no candidate receives a
- 5 majority of the votes cast, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for the
- 6 office shall be in a runoff to be held on the same day as a runoff from the general primary,
- 7 as provided by state law, to determine which candidate will be on the general election ballot.

8 SECTION 5.

- 9 The names of all candidates for the office of chief magistrate shall appear in a separate
- 10 section of each primary and general election ballot of each elector. No party designation or
- affiliation shall appear beside the name of any such candidate on any primary or general
- 12 election ballot, and no candidate for the office of chief magistrate shall be nominated by any
- 13 political party.

SECTION 6.

15 This Act is enacted pursuant to the authority of Code Section 21-2-139 of the O.C.G.A.

SECTION 7.

17 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
