A RESOLUTION

1 Expressing regret at the passing of Virginia Colquitt Almon; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, on April 21, 2000, the State of Georgia lost one of its finest and most  
3 distinguished citizens with the untimely passing of Virginia Colquitt Almon; and

4 WHEREAS, she was a long-time resident of Carrollton who devoted her life to her  
5 community through her service as owner and operator of Almon Funeral Home for 50 years;

7 WHEREAS, this beloved lady was actively involved in the civic, religious, and charitable  
8 affairs of her community and gave unstintingly and unceasingly of her time, talents, and  
9 energy to improve the quality of life in her community, as dramatically evidenced by her  
10 membership of the First Baptist Church and her membership in the American Legion  
11 Auxiliary, the Carrollton Historical Society, the Cultural Alliance, the Abraham Baldwin  
12 Chapter, D.A.R. and the State University of West Georgia; and

17 leaves an unfillable void in the hearts and lives of her family and friends.

19 the members of this body express their deepest and most sincere regret at the passing of  
20 Virginia Colquitt Almon.
