## House Bill 250 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Titles 40 and 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor
- 2 vehicles and traffic and to revenue and taxation, respectively, so as to redesignate certain
- 3 provisions relating to motor vehicle license fees and plates; to correct certain cross-references
- 4 and conform to such redesignation; to amend Title 32 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 5 Annotated, relating to highways, bridges, and ferries, so as to correct certain cross-references
- 6 and conform to such redesignation; to provide for applicability; to provide that this Act shall
- 7 not abate or affect prosecutions, punishments, penalties, administrative proceedings or
- 8 remedies, or civil actions related to certain violations; to provide for related matters; to
- 9 provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 35 Said Title 48, relating to revenue and taxation, is further amended by reserving the
- 36 designation of Chapter 10.

SECTION 3.

2 Said Title 40, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is further amended by designating Code

3 Sections 40-2-150 through 40-2-166, inclusively, as Article 7 of Chapter 2.

- 5 Said Title 40 is further amended by striking "chapter" and inserting in lieu thereof "article"
- 6 wherever the former term appears in:
- 7 (1) Code Section 40-2-150, relating to definitions;
- 8 (2) Code Section 40-2-151, relating to annual license fees for operation of vehicles and
- 9 fees for permanent licensing of certain trailers;
- 10 (3) Code Section 40-2-154, relating to license plates for different classes of vehicles and

- 12 (4) Code Section 40-2-156, relating to rate of annual license fees for certain vehicles
- registered during specified parts of the year;

- 16 (6) Code Section 40-2-159, relating to time of applications and payment for plates;
- 17 (7) Code Section 40-2-160, relating to liability of resident and nonresident motor vehicle

- special plates;
- 21 (8) Code Section 40-2-161, relating to rate of annual license fee for vehicles carrying
- passengers over route of 50 miles or less; and
- 23 (9) Code Section 40-2-166, relating to violation of chapter and penalties.

- 26 bridges, and ferries; motor vehicles and traffic; and revenue and taxation, respectively, are

- 22 (3) Striking "Code Section 48-10-12" and inserting in lieu thereof "Code Section
- 23 40-2-162" wherever the former reference appears in Code Section 32-6-30, relating to
- stopping vehicles for purposes of weighing, measuring, or inspecting, reports of
- violations, and refusal to stop; and
- 26 (4) Striking ", 48-10-16," where such reference and punctuation appear in subsection (d)
- of Code Section 48-11-14, relating to registration, reports, and tax payments of persons
- 28 acquiring cigars and cigarettes subject to tax under Code Section 48-11-13, assessment
- of tax due from person failing to file or filing incorrect report, hearing, and penalties.

30 **SECTION 6.** 

- 31 Said Title 40, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is further amended by striking "Chapter
- 32 10 of Title 48" and inserting in lieu thereof "Article 7 of this chapter" wherever the former
- 33 reference appears in Code Section 40-2-70, relating to special license plates for disabled
- veterans not qualifying under Code Section 40-2-69.

SECTION 7.

2 The amendments made by this Act shall apply to provisions of such Code sections as

- 3 currently existing and as amended after approval of this Act by any Act approved prior to this
- 4 Act, particularly but not exclusively by an Act approved April 28, 2000 (Ga. L. 2000, p.
- 5 951).

6 SECTION 8.

- 7 This Act shall not abate any prosecution, punishment, penalty, administrative proceedings
- 8 or remedies, or civil action related to any violation of law committed prior to the effective
- 9 date of this Act.

SECTION 9.

11 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2002.

13 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
