**AS PASSED SENATE**

**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT**

1 To amend an Act creating the Board of Commissioners of Forsyth County, approved June 30,  
2 1964 (Ga. L. 1964, Ex. Sess., p. 2225), as amended, particularly by an Act approved  
3 April 16, 1999 (Ga. L. 1999, p. 4551), so as to change the compensation and per diem  
4 expense allowance of the chairperson and members of the board of commissioners; to  
5 provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 An Act creating the Board of Commissioners of Forsyth County, approved June 30, 1964  
9 (Ga. L. 1964, Ex. Sess., p. 2225), as amended, particularly by an Act approved April 16,  
10 1999 (Ga. L. 1999, p. 4551), is amended by striking Section 7 and inserting in lieu thereof  
11 a new Section 7 to read as follows:

12 **"SECTION 7.**

13 (a) The chairperson of the board of commissioners shall receive a salary of \$600.00 per  
14 month, payable out of the funds of Forsyth County. The compensation of the other  
15 members of the board of commissioners shall be \$500.00 per month, payable out of the  
16 funds of Forsyth County.

17 (b) The chairperson and each member of the board shall receive the sum of \$75.00 as an  
18 expense allowance for each day's actual attendance at a meeting of the board or any  
19 meeting of any other governmental or public board, council, committee, authority, or  
20 commission at which said member is representing the Board of Commissioners of Forsyth  
21 County or a political subdivision of Forsyth County, but shall receive the same for not  
22 more than 15 days per month. Said expense allowance shall be payable out of the funds  
23 of Forsyth County.

1 (c) The chairperson and other members of the board shall also be entitled to actual  
2 expenses incurred while on county business, to be payable from the funds of Forsyth  
3 County."

4 **SECTION 2.**

5 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
6 without such approval.

7 **SECTION 3.**

8 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
