WHEREAS, U.S. Olympian Robin Byrd Goad, a native Georgian who was born and raised
in Newnan, brought fame and honor to her country, state, and community as she finished in
5th Place in the 105lbs. weight division at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia;

6 WHEREAS, she is the most decorated female athlete in the history of USA weightlifting and

7 has held world titles, world records, and numerous honors from several of the nation's most

- 10 age of 17 and was the only female Olympian to compete in Sydney who was also present at
- 11 the first world championship; and
- 12 WHEREAS, she was the 1999 Pan American Gold Medalist and the 1994 World Champion
- 13 and was named Georgia Sports Woman of the Year 2000; and she has been a pioneer for the
- 14 sport of weightlifting and currently serves on the USA Weightlifting Board of Directors and
- 15 the US Olympic Committee Athletes Congress in recognition of her talent and zeal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
commend U.S. Olympian Robin Byrd Goad for her superb record at the 2000 Olympic
Games and her tremendous achievements in the sport of weightlifting.
