## A RESOLUTION

1 Expressing regret at the passing of Mrs. Marion Geneva Lyde; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, on July 16, 2000, the State of Georgia lost one of its finest and most  
3 distinguished citizens with the untimely passing of Mrs. Marion Geneva Lyde; and

4 WHEREAS, she was a long-time resident of Brunswick who devoted her life to her  
5 community through her service and dedication to the betterment of the people of the  
6 community; and

7 WHEREAS, this beloved lady was actively involved in the civic, religious, and charitable  
8 affairs of her community and gave unstintingly and unceasingly of her time, talents, and  
9 energy to improve the quality of life in her community, as dramatically evidenced by her  
10 membership for many years on the Glynn County Board of Education and her leadership in  
11 the NAACP, the Democratic Party, the Girl Scouts of America, and many religious and  
12 charitable organizations; and

13 WHEREAS, her unparalleled organizational and leadership talents, her remarkable patience  
14 and diplomacy, her keen sense of vision, and her acute sensitivity to the needs of the citizens  
15 of her community earned her the respect and admiration of her colleagues and associates; and

16 WHEREAS, the untimely passing of this generous, unselfish, and devoted family woman  
17 leaves an unfillable void in the hearts and lives of her family and friends.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
19 express their deepest and most sincere regret at the passing of Mrs. Marion Geneva Lyde.
