A RESOLUTION

1 Commending Earl C. Robinson and recognizing March 1, 2001, as Earl C. Robinson Day in
2 Georgia; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Earl C. Robinson is the assistant director of legislative and political action for
4 the Machinists Non-Partisan Political League; and

5 WHEREAS, in his position, Mr. Robinson is dedicated to political advocacy and lobbying
6 on behalf of employment issues and other policies affecting the wage earning class of
7 workers in this country for the purpose of safeguarding the welfare and interests of such
8 workers; and

9 WHEREAS, Mr. Robinson is extremely effective in focusing legislative attention on the
10 concerns of workers and in helping to protect the rights of workers from political
11 infringement; and

12 WHEREAS, he is a 20 year veteran of political campaigns on the local, state, and national
13 levels; and

14 WHEREAS, from 1970 to 1973, he was employed as a staff organizer for the International
15 Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers and Industrial Union Department; and

16 WHEREAS, from 1961 to 1970, he served as a materials clerk for Cameron Iron Works and
17 served in various offices of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace
18 Workers in Lodge 15; and

19 WHEREAS, among many other activities, he is a member and first vice president of the
20 United Neighborhood Centers of America, Inc.; a member of the national executive
21 committee of the A. Philip Randolph Institute; a member of the board of directors of the

1 National Coalition of Black Voter Participation, Inc.; vice president of the Urban Heights
2 Voters League; and cochairperson of the Black Affairs Committee of the Texas AFL-CIO.

3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
4 the members of this body commend Earl C. Robinson for his valuable participation in the
5 American political and democratic process and recognize March 1, 2001, as Earl C.
6 Robinson Day in Georgia.

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
8 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Earl C. Robinson.
