# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 12-7-6 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the minimum requirements for rules, regulations, ordinances, or resolutions relative to the control of soil erosion and sedimentation, so as to change certain provisions relating to the maximum allowable turbidity allowed in storm-water runoff; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

### **SECTION 1.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 Code Section 12-7-6 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the minimum 9 requirements for rules, regulations, ordinances, or resolutions relative to the control of soil 10 erosion and sedimentation, is amended by striking paragraph (2) of subsection (a) and 11 inserting in lieu thereof the following:

12 "(2) A discharge of storm-water runoff from disturbed areas where best management 13 practices have not been properly designed, installed, and maintained shall constitute a 14 separate violation of any land-disturbing permit issued by a local issuing authority or by 15 the division or of any general permit for construction activities issued by the division 16 pursuant to subsection (f) of Code Section 12-5-30 for each day on which such discharge 17 results in the turbidity of receiving waters being increased by more than 25 500 nephelometric turbidity units for waters supporting warm water fisheries or by more than 18 ten nephelometric turbidity units for waters classified as trout waters. The turbidity of the 19 20 receiving waters shall be measured in accordance with guidelines to be issued by the 21 director."

#### **SECTION 2.**

23 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
