#### A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing February 22, 2001, as the First Annual Georgia Human Relations Day; and for  
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, on Thursday, February 22, 2001, the Governor's Office of Human Relations  
4 will host the First Annual Georgia Human Relations Day at the Capitol; and

5 WHEREAS, the mission of the Governor's Office of Human Relations is to assist the state  
6 and its people to achieve a positive human relations climate that assures fairness among all  
7 individuals and groups while facilitating access to governmental services and resources; and

8 WHEREAS, the purpose of this historical event is to celebrate the strength and richness of  
9 Georgia's diverse communities, to share the common respect for family values and unity, and  
10 to raise awareness of community concerns; and

11 WHEREAS, this event will include a Cultural "Edu-tainment" in the Round program  
12 featuring dancing and musical and dramatic performances from the African American, Asian  
13 American, Hispanic, Caribbean, European, and Native American communities; and

14 WHEREAS, this celebration brings together citizens, community organizations, students,  
15 businesses, faith communities, policy makers, and government in partnership, sharing a  
16 vision of a state that is strong because of its diversity.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
18 the members of this body recognize the foregoing by designating February 22, 2001, as the  
19 First Annual Georgia Human Relations Day and pledge commitment to policies and  
20 programs which support positive human relations and an appreciation of the diversity of the  
21 people of Georgia.
