## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending John S. Day on becoming an Eagle Scout; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, John S. Day has earned the rank of Eagle Scout, to be awarded during a  
3 ceremony on February 27, 2001; and
- 4 WHEREAS, since 1911, the Eagle has been the symbol of the highest achievement among  
5 the Boy Scouts of America; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the attainment of Eagle Scout rank indicates that a Scout has developed  
7 leadership ability, self-confidence, mature judgment, and mental and physical capabilities  
8 that will be of immense benefit throughout life; and
- 9 WHEREAS, John S. Day has amply demonstrated to his Scout leaders and peers that he  
10 possesses these qualities along with sterling character; and
- 11 WHEREAS, for a Scout to reach Eagle rank, he must earn 21 merit badges, 11 of which are  
12 mandatory requirements for the Eagle Scout program; and
- 13 WHEREAS, John S. Day has met these demanding requirements through diligent effort; and
- 14 WHEREAS, in achieving Eagle Scout status, John S. Day has brought honor not only to  
15 himself but also to his family and troop.
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
17 the members of this body recognize and commend John S. Day for his diligence and  
18 dedication in pursuing the highest honor awarded by the Boy Scouts of America and  
19 congratulate him on attaining the prestigious rank of Eagle Scout.
