AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 11 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 emergency medical services, so as to provide for the transfer of certification and
- 3 recertification responsibilities for paramedics and cardiac technicians to the Department of
- 4 Human Resources from the Composite State Board of Medical Examiners; to provide for
- 5 definitions; to provide for certification and recertification of emergency medical technicians,
- 6 paramedics, and cardiac technicians by that department; to provide for revocations,
- 7 investigations, subpoenas, and hearings by that department; to provide for that department
- 8 to become the successor to the rules, regulations, policies, procedures, and administrative
- 9 orders of the Composite State Board of Medical Examiners; to provide for conforming
- 10 changes; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

12 SECTION 1.

- 13 Chapter 11 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to emergency
- medical services, is amended by striking paragraphs (5) and (16) and adding paragraph (6.1)
- 15 following paragraph (6) of Code Section 31-11-2, relating to definitions, and inserting in
- 16 their respective places the following:

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- 17 "(5) 'Cardiac technician' means a person who, having been trained and certified as an
- 18 emergency medical technician and having completed additional training in advanced
- cardiac life support techniques in a training course approved by the department, is so
- certified by the Composite State Board of Medical Examiners <u>prior to January 1, 2002,</u>
- or the Department of Human Resources on and after January 1, 2002.."
- 22 "(6.1) 'Department' means the Department of Human Resources."
- 23 "(16) 'Paramedic' means any person who has been certified as an advanced emergency
- 24 medical technician by the composite board before July 1, 1988 January 1, 2002, or any
- 25 person who has been certified by that board on or after July 1, 1988, by the department
- 26 <u>on or after January 1, 2002,</u> as having been trained in emergency care techniques in a

1 paramedic training course approved by the department, but all such persons shall be

2 designated on and after July 1, 1988, as paramedics."

3 SECTION 2.

- 4 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 31-11-51, relating to certification
- 5 and recertification of emergency medical technicians, and inserting in its place the following:
- 6 "31-11-51.
- 7 The board shall, by regulation, authorize the department to establish procedures and
- 8 standards for certifying and recertifying emergency medical technicians. The department
- 9 <u>shall succeed to all rules and regulations, policies, procedures, and administrative orders</u>
- of the composite board which were in effect on December 31, 2001, and which relate to the
- functions transferred to the department by this chapter. Such rules, regulations, policies,
- 12 procedures, and administrative orders shall remain in effect until amended, repealed,
- 13 superseded, or nullified by proper authority or as otherwise provided by law."

SECTION 3.

- 15 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 31-11-52, relating to certification
- and recertification of and training for paramedics and cardiac technicians, and inserting in
- 17 its place the following:
- 18 "31-11-52.
- 19 (a) The composite board department shall establish procedures and standards for certifying
- and recertifying paramedics and cardiac technicians. An applicant for initial certification
- as a paramedic or a cardiac technician must:
- 22 (1) Submit a completed application on a form to be prescribed by the composite board
- 23 <u>department</u>, which shall include evidence that the applicant is 18 years of age or older and
- is of good moral character;
- 25 (2) Submit from the department a notarized statement that the applicant has completed
- a training course approved by the department;
- 27 (3) Submit to the composite board department a fee as set forth in the regulations of the
- 28 composite board department; and
- 29 (4) Meet such other requirements as are set forth in the rules and regulations of the
- 30 composite board department.
- 31 (b) The department shall also adopt procedures and standards for its approval of paramedic
- training courses and cardiac technician training courses. The department shall adopt such
- regulations after consultation with the composite board and other appropriate public and
- private agencies and organizations concerned with medical education and the practice of

1 medicine. Procedures and standards adopted by the department shall be consistent with the

2 purposes and provisions of this chapter."

3 SECTION 4.

- 4 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 31-11-54, relating to services
- 5 which may be rendered by paramedics and paramedic trainees, and inserting in its place the
- 6 following:
- 7 "31-11-54.
- 8 (a) Upon certification by the composite board department, paramedics may perform any
- 9 service that a cardiac technician is permitted to perform. In addition, upon the order of a
- duly licensed physician and subject to the conditions set forth in paragraph (2) of
- subsection (a) of Code Section 31-11-55, paramedics may perform any other procedures
- which they have been both trained and certified to perform, including, but not limited to:
- 13 (1) Administration of parenteral injections of diuretics, anticonvulsants, hypertonic
- 14 glucose, antihistamines, bronchodilators, emetics, narcotic antagonists, and others;
- 15 (2) Cardioversion; and
- 16 (3) Gastric suction by intubation.
- 17 (b) While in training preparatory to becoming certified, paramedic trainees may perform
- any of the functions specified in this Code section under the direct supervision of a duly
- licensed physician, a registered nurse, or an approved paramedic clinical preceptor."

20 SECTION 5.

- 21 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 31-11-55, relating to services
- 22 which may be rendered by cardiac technicians and trainees, and inserting in its place the
- 23 following:
- 24 *"*31-11-55.
- 25 (a) Upon certification by the composite board department, cardiac technicians may do any
- of the following:
- 27 (1) Render first-aid and resuscitation services;
- 28 (2) Upon the order of a duly licensed physician and as recommended by the Emergency
- Health Services Advisory Council and approved by the composite board department:
- 30 (A) Perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation and defibrillation in a pulseless,
- 31 nonbreathing patient;
- 32 (B) Administer approved intravenous solutions;
- 33 (C) Administer parenteral injections of antiarrhythmic agents, vagolytic agents,
- 34 chronotropic agents, alkalizing agents, analgesic agents, and vasopressor agents; and
- 35 (D) Perform pulmonary ventilation by esophageal airway and endotracheal intubation.

1 (b) While in training preparatory to becoming certified, cardiac technician trainees may

- 2 perform any of the functions specified in this Code section under the direct supervision of
- a duly licensed physician or a registered nurse."

4 SECTION 6.

- 5 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 31-11-57, relating to revocation of
- 6 certificates issued to paramedics and cardiac technicians, and inserting in its place the
- 7 following:
- 8 "31-11-57.
- 9 Certificates issued to paramedics and cardiac technicians pursuant to this chapter may be
- revoked for good cause by the composite board department in accordance with established
- rules and regulations, after notice to the certificate holder of the charges and an opportunity
- for hearing. Such proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 13 of Title
- 50, the 'Georgia Administrative Procedure Act.' The composite board department shall
- have the authority to conduct investigations and subpoena any documents relating to the
- 15 fitness of paramedics and cardiac technicians. Such documents may be used in any hearing
- 16 conducted by the composite board department."

17 SECTION 7.

- 18 Said chapter is further amended by striking Code Section 31-11-58.1, relating to
- 19 recertification of paramedics and cardiac technicians and applicable continuing education
- 20 requirements, and inserting in its place the following:
- 21 "31-11-58.1.
- 22 (a) The composite board department shall be authorized to require paramedics and cardiac
- 23 technicians seeking recertification under this chapter to complete department approved
- 24 continuing education of not less than 40 hours biennially. The department shall be
- 25 authorized to approve courses including but not limited to courses offered by the
- department, the number of hours required, and the category in which these hours should
- be earned.
- 28 (b) The composite board department shall be authorized to waive the continuing education
- requirement in cases of hardship, disability, illness, or under such other circumstances as
- 30 the composite board department deems appropriate.
- 31 (c) The composite board department shall be authorized to promulgate rules and
- 32 regulations to implement and ensure compliance with the requirements of this Code
- 33 section.
- 34 (d) This Code section shall apply to each certification and recertification cycle which
- begins after the 1992-1993 renewal <u>deadline in 2000</u>."

1 SECTION 8.

2 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
