

House Resolution 392

A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House Local Assistance Road Program Study Committee; and for other
2 purposes.

3 WHEREAS, increased funding of the local assistance road program is crucial to the
4 continued economic development of this state; and

5 WHEREAS, there is a need to review such laws relating to that program and the manner of
6 its funding to determine whether any reform, revision, or modernization of such laws is
7 necessary and appropriate under current economic conditions so as to better fulfill the
8 purposes of such laws.

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
10 there is created the House Local Assistance Road Program Study Committee to be composed
11 of five members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the
12 House of Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as
13 chairperson of the committee. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions,
15 needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action
16 or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may
17 conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
18 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
19 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The members of the committee
20 shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of
21 Georgia Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by
22 any member of the committee for more than three days unless additional days are authorized.
23 The funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from the funds
24 appropriated to the House of Representatives. In the event the committee makes a report of
25 its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such

1 report shall be made on or before December 1, 2001. The committee shall stand abolished
2 on December 1, 2001.
