## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia to consider the granting
- 2 of foreign language credit to those students who demonstrate proficiency in American Sign
- 3 Language; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, over 400,000 Georgians are deaf or hard of hearing, and there is an increasing
- 5 need for communication between hearing Georgians and Georgians who are deaf; and
- 6 WHEREAS, in 1992, the General Assembly enacted Code Section 20-2-151.1 which
- 7 provides for the acceptance of demonstrated proficiency in American Sign Language for the
- 8 purpose of fulfilling the foreign language requirements for a college preparatory curriculum
- 9 seal of endorsement on a high school diploma and for the purpose of earning Carnegie unit
- 10 curriculum credits; and
- 11 WHEREAS, every effort should be made to encourage proficiency in American Sign
- 12 Language and to recognize those who become proficient; and
- WHEREAS, the colleges and universities in the state perform an outstanding service in
- 14 educating teachers and other professionals who should be able to communicate with deaf or
- 15 hard of hearing citizens.
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 GEORGIA that the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia is urged to
- 18 consider the granting of foreign language credit to those students who demonstrate
- 19 proficiency in American Sign Language.
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 21 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Board of Regents of the University
- 22 System of Georgia.
