## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing Faith and Family Day in Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the peace and prosperity of a nation are based upon the strength of the families  
3 that make up that nation; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the United States of America is a nation whose families have traditionally  
5 observed a firm reliance upon God; and
- 6 WHEREAS, our commonly shared beliefs and values have enabled us, regardless of faith,  
7 race, or national origin, to foster the ideal of becoming one nation under God; and
- 8 WHEREAS, these religiously inspired values have also served as the cornerstone for  
9 maintaining strong, cohesive, and productive families; and
- 10 WHEREAS, throughout America's history, whenever there was a national crisis, men and  
11 women of faith stepped forward to challenge, encourage, and lead the nation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, from February 25 through April 16, 2001, the Family Federation for World  
13 Peace and Unification is holding faith and family programs in each of the 50 states of our  
14 nation, calling upon men and women of faith to rebuild the family, restore the community,  
15 and renew the nation; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the Atlanta event, being held at the Renaissance Concourse Hotel on March 4,  
17 2001, will bring together community leaders, including clergy, elected officials, and business  
18 and academic leaders to solve our most pressing social problems.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
20 recognize March 4, 2001, as Faith and Family Day in the State of Georgia.

- 1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 2 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Tom Cutts, Georgia President of the
- 3 Family Federation for World Peace and Unification.
