A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the Georgia Association, Family Career and Community Leaders of America
2 and "FCCLA Week in Georgia"; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the Georgia Association, Family Career and Community Leaders of America,
4 formerly known as The Future Homemakers, is a professional organization for high school
5 students enrolled in the Family and Consumer Sciences Program, and likewise students
6 enrolled in the College of Family and Consumer Sciences at the University of Georgia; and

7 WHEREAS, the Georgia Association, FCCLA, has more than 250 local FCCLA high school
8 chapters; and

9 WHEREAS, the FCCLA is the largest youth organization in Georgia; and

10 WHEREAS, the FCCLA is the only student organization operating through the nation's
11 schools with the family as its central focus; and

12 WHEREAS, the Georgia FCCLA members recognize their responsibility to the community:
13 to promote personal growth and leadership development through family and consumer
14 sciences education, focusing on the multiple roles of family members, wage earners, and
15 community leaders, and skills for life development; and

16 WHEREAS, FCCLA teaches members to be leaders, awards and recognizes students and
17 advisors for outstanding accomplishments, and encourages community involvement and
18 responsibility; and

19 WHEREAS, FCCLA maintains a series of chapter, state, and national competitive activities
20 designed to stimulate and motivate classroom interest, career encouragement, and technical
21 competence.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that this body does hereby
2 proclaim the week of February 11-17, 2001, as "FCCLA Week" in Georgia.

3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body commends the Georgia Association, FCCLA,
4 for making the family its central focus and commends all members for their many
5 achievements.

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body recognizes Mrs. Charla H. Allen, the
7 Executive Director of the Georgia Association, FCCLA of America, as an outstanding leader
8 and a superlative educator.
