## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending the Blue Ridge Rifles and Color Guard of North Georgia College and State
- 2 University as the national champion collegiate precision military drill team of 2001; and for
- 3 other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, North Georgia College and State University in Dahlonega, Lumpkin County,
- 5 Georgia, is the military college of the State of Georgia; and
- 6 WHEREAS, North Georgia College and State University is one of only six senior military
- 7 colleges in the United States which prepare young men and women to assume positions of
- 8 leadership both in their communities and the Armed Forces of this country; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the Blue Ridge Rifles and the Color Guard are an integral component of the
- 10 "Boar's Head Brigade," the Corps of Cadets of North Georgia College and State University;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, for over four decades, the Blue Ridge Rifles and the Color Guard of North
- 13 Georgia College and State University have represented the State of Georgia through
- 14 precision drill exhibition and competition; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the annual Tulane Naval ROTC Mardi Gras Invitational Drill Meet in New
- 16 Orleans, Louisiana, is widely recognized as the national championship for college precision
- 17 military drill teams; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Tulane Naval ROTC Mardi Gras Invitational Drill Meet draws teams
- 19 representing the college based officer commissioning programs of the Army, Marine Corps,
- 20 Navy, and Air Force including the service academies, senior and junior military colleges, and
- 21 reserve officer training corps programs at civilian college and universities; and

1 WHEREAS, the Blue Ridge Rifles and the Color Guard of North Georgia College and State

- 2 University have dominated the Tulane NROTC Mardi Gras Invitational Drill Meet since
- 3 1988, winning the championship in 1988, 1989, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1998, and 2000, more
- 4 than any other college precision drill team; and
- 5 WHEREAS, on February 23, 2001, the Blue Ridge Rifles under the command of Cadet
- 6 Captain Phillip Pelphry and Drill Master, Cadet Master Sergeant Zachary Poole and the
- 7 Color Guard, under the command of Cadet Captain Chris Rivers once again represented the
- 8 State of Georgia at the 29th Annual Tulane NROTC Mardi Gras Invitational Drill Meet; and
- 9 WHEREAS, at said drill meet, the North Georgia cadets competed against 42 military drill
- 10 teams from colleges throughout the United States including the United States Military
- 11 Academy, the United States Air Force Academy, and the United States Naval Academy; and
- 12 WHEREAS, at said meet, the Blue Ridge Rifles received first place in platoon basic drill,
- 13 second place in squad drill, and first place in platoon exhibition drill; and
- 14 WHEREAS, at said meet, the North Georgia College and State University Color Guard
- 15 received first place in the color guard competition; and
- 16 WHEREAS, based on said results, the North Georgia College and State University was the
- 17 top ranked precision drill team and color guard at the Tulane NROTC Mardi Gras
- 18 Invitational Drill Meet 2001 and thereby the national champion precision military drill team;
- 19 and
- 20 WHEREAS, the Blue Ridge Rifles and the Color Guard have thereby brought great honor
- 21 on themselves, the Boar's Head Brigade, North Georgia College and State University, and
- the State of Georgia.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 24 commend the Blue Ridge Rifles and the Color Guard of North Georgia College and State
- 25 University for their performance and achievement this year as well as their record of
- 26 dedication, commitment, and contributions to their university and to this state.
- 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 28 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the cadet commanders of the Blue Ridge
