**ADOPTED**

A RESOLUTION

1 Commending the Brookwood High School Girls Swim and Diving Team; and for other  
2 purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the Brookwood High School Girls Swim and Diving Team won the Inaugural  
4 Class AAAAA State Championship held at Westminster High School in Atlanta, Georgia,  
5 on Saturday, February 17, 2001, and brought fame and honor to the team and the school; and

6 WHEREAS, the team's outstanding performance was especially exciting and noteworthy  
7 since this was the first state championship for the girls swim and diving team; and

8 WHEREAS, Christie Hupman won the 50 freestyle for the third straight year and Amanda  
9 Weir won the 200 freestyle, tying the state all-classification record and setting a new state  
10 all-classification record for the 100 freestyle; and

11 WHEREAS, the team of Andrea Hupman, Kimberly Morris, Emily Armond, and Christie  
12 Hupman won the 200 medley relay; and the team of Christie Hupman, Andrea Hupman,  
13 Kimberly Morris, and Amanda Weir won the 200 freestyle relay; and

14 WHEREAS, the 400 freestyle relay was won by the team of Emily Armond, Meredith  
15 Alfrey, Melissa VanderWood, and Amanda Weir; and this year's team earned a total of 307  
16 points to defeat Chattahoochee High School for the state title.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
18 recognize and commend the Brookwood High School Girls Swim and Diving Team on their  
19 spectacular performance in winning the Inaugural Class AAAAA State Championship and  
20 convey to the team and their coaches their heartiest congratulations and best wishes.
