# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 19-3-30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to issuance of marriage licenses, so as to change the persons to whom such licenses may be directed; to amend Chapter 30 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions applicable to municipalities, so as to authorize mayors to perform marriage ceremonies; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

#### **SECTION 1.**

8 Code Section 19-3-30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to issuance of
9 marriage licenses, is amended by striking subsection (c) thereof and inserting in its place the
10 following:

11 "(c) The license shall be directed to any judge, including judges of state and federal courts 12 of record in this state, city recorder, mayor, magistrate, minister, or other person of any religious society or sect authorized by the rules of such society to perform the marriage 13 14 ceremony; such license shall authorize the marriage of the persons therein named and 15 require the judge, city recorder, <u>mayor</u>, magistrate, minister, or other authorized person to return the license to the judge of the probate court with the certificate thereon as to the fact 16 17 and date of marriage within 30 days after the date of the marriage. The license with the 18 return thereon shall be recorded by the judge in a book kept by such judge for that purpose." 19

#### **SECTION 2.**

Chapter 30 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
provisions applicable to municipalities, is amended by adding at the end a new Code section
to read as follows:

24 *"*36-30-14.

25 The mayor of any municipality is authorized to perform marriage ceremonies."
