A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Terrence Trammell; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Terrence Trammell is one of the premier track and field athletes in the world;
3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, a native of Atlanta and a graduate of Southwest DeKalb High School in
5 Decatur, Georgia, Terrence Trammell won a silver medal at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney
6 in the 110 meter hurdles and a gold medal in the 4x100 relay; and
- 7 WHEREAS, most recently, he emerged as the top male athlete of the USA Track and Field
8 2001 Indoor Golden Spike Tour, which concluded on March 4 at the Pontiac Grand Prix
9 USA Indoor Track and Field Championships held at the Georgia Dome, where the top prize
10 included a 2001 Pontiac Grand Prix automobile; and
- 11 WHEREAS, before 12,000 hometown fans, Terrence won the 60 meter hurdles event with
12 a time of 7.49 seconds and qualified for the World Indoor Championships to be held in
13 Lisbon, Portugal, on March 9-11, 2001; and
- 14 WHEREAS, a student at the University of South Carolina, Terrence was named National
15 Track Athlete of the Year during the 2000 spring NCAA season; and
- 16 WHEREAS, he is a three-time NCAA champion, eight-time All American, five-time SEC
17 champion, and a two-time Gold Medalist at the 1999 World University Games; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Terrence is an exceptionally talented athlete who, by his drive and
19 determination to succeed, has brought great honor to himself, his community, and his state;
20 and
- 21 WHEREAS, his proud parents are Ann and Leonard Trammell.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
2 commend and congratulate Terrence Trammell, a world-class athlete and track and field star,
3 and extend to him best wishes for continued success in all of his endeavors.
