AS PASSED SENATE

**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT**

1 To amend an Act establishing the State Court of Wayne County (formerly the City Court of
2 Jesup, in and for the County of Wayne), approved July 31, 1916 (Ga. L. 1916, p. 248), as
3 amended, particularly by an Act approved March 17, 1958 (Ga. L. 1958, p. 2525), and
4 particularly by an Act approved March 30, 1993 (Ga. L. 1993, p. 4328), so as to change the
5 salary of the judge and solicitor; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and
6 for other purposes.

7 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 An Act establishing the State Court of Wayne County (formerly the City Court of Jesup, in
10 and for the County of Wayne), approved July 31, 1916 (Ga. L. 1916, p. 248), as amended,
11 particularly by an Act approved March 17, 1958 (Ga. L. 1958, p. 2525), and particularly by
12 an Act approved March 30, 1993 (Ga. L. 1993, p. 4328), is amended by striking Section 3
13 of said amendatory Act of 1958 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Section 3
14 to read as follows:

15 "Section 3. The judge of the State Court of Wayne County shall be paid an annual salary
16 equal to the sum of 40 percent of the annual salary of a judge of superior court. Such
17 salary shall be paid in monthly installments from the funds of Wayne County at the
18 direction of the board of commissioners of Wayne County."

19 **SECTION 2.**

20 Said Act is further amended by striking Section 4 of said amendatory Act of 1958 in its
21 entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Section 4 to read as follows:

22 "Section 4. The solicitor of the State Court of Wayne County shall be paid an annual salary
23 equal to the sum of 40 percent of the annual salary of a judge of superior court. Such
24 salary shall be paid in monthly installments from the funds of Wayne County at the
25 direction of the board of commissioners of Wayne County."

1 **SECTION 3.**

2 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2002.

3 **SECTION 4.**

4 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
