A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing Law's High Noon as the 2001 National Field Trial Champion; and for other
2 purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Law's High Noon from Statesboro recently won the 2001 National Field Trial
4 Championship for Bird Dogs in the Open All-Age Class; and

5 WHEREAS, this prestigious National Championship, which was first organized and run in
6 1896 and since 1915 has been held on the Ames Plantation in Grand Junction, Tennessee,
7 represents the peak of achievement in field trial competition; and

8 WHEREAS, during the 2000-2001 season, Law's High Noon also won the Saskatchewan
9 Open Chicken Championship (60 dogs competing) and the Buck Tuck (95 dogs competing);
10 and he was runner-up at the Southeastern (66 dogs competing) and Continental (102 dogs
11 competing); and

12 WHEREAS, his front-running nature, classy style, and keen bird-finding ability
13 distinguished him above his nationally renowned competitors; and

14 WHEREAS, it is only fitting and proper that this champion along with owners Joe Johnston,
15 Gary Futch, and Howard Tucker of Statesboro and handler Ricky Furney of Leesburg be
16 recognized by this body.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
18 the members of this body recognize Law's High Noon as the 2001 National Field Trial
19 Champion and commend his owners and handler for their outstanding record of
20 achievement.
