A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Beaverbrook Elementary School as a Master School; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Beaverbrook Elementary School in Griffin, Georgia, was recognized by The
3 Institute of Academic Excellence in Madison, Wisconsin, for its excellent reading program
4 in all 26 classrooms plus the pre-K and special education classes and awarded the distinction
5 of being designated a Master School; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Institute of Academic Excellence encourages schools to focus attention on
7 reading skills and comprehension and promotes the acquisition of an extensive library for
8 readers at all levels of ability; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Beaverbrook Elementary School became a Reading Renaissance Master School
10 and a Master Library on February 9, 2001, and joins a select group as the seventh Master
11 School in the United States and the second Master School in Georgia; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Louise Warren, Media Specialist, is the coordinator of the Accelerated
13 Reader/Reading Renaissance program whose diligence and dedication merit high praise.
- 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
15 recognize and commend Beaverbrook Elementary School on its achievement as a Master
16 School with a Master Library and convey their hearty congratulations and best wishes to the
17 school, its wonderful staff, and its fine administration.
