Expressing regret at the passing of Edward John Mangham; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, he was born in Spalding County on July 14, 1933, to Arkie Miller and Eddie Mangham, and he received his early education in the Spalding County school system and attended Morehouse College before he was drafted to serve in the Korean Conflict, where he was trained as a paratrooper; and

WHEREAS, he was a loving husband and an understanding father to his children who have sought to honor him in their lives' work and who will cherish his memory forever.
