

House Bill 44

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To provide a homestead exemption from Greene County ad valorem taxes for county
2 purposes in the amount of \$8,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for certain
3 residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over; to provide for definitions; to specify
4 the terms and conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for
5 applicability; to provide for a referendum, effective dates, and automatic repeal; to repeal
6 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 (a) As used in this Act, the term:

10 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for county purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for county
11 purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of Greene County, including, but not limited to, ad
12 valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county bonded indebtedness.

13 (2) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
14 the O.C.G.A., as amended.

15 (3) "Senior citizen" means a person who is 65 years of age or over on or before January
16 1 of the year in which application for the exemption under this Act is made.

17 (b) Each resident of Greene County who is a senior citizen is granted an exemption on that
18 person's homestead from all Greene County ad valorem taxes for county purposes in the
19 amount of \$8,000.00 of the assessed value of that homestead. The value of that property in
20 excess of such exempted amount shall remain subject to taxation.

21 (c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this
22 section unless the person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner of
23 Greene County giving the person's age and such additional information relative to receiving
24 such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner to make a determination regarding the
25 initial and continuing eligibility of such owner for such exemption. The tax commissioner
26 shall provide application forms for this purpose.

1 (d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of
 2 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year
 3 so long as the owner occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the
 4 proper application as provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to
 5 make application thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to
 6 such person. It shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under
 7 subsection (b) of this section to notify the tax commissioner of Greene County in the event
 8 that person for any reason becomes ineligible for that exemption.

9 (e) The exemption granted by this subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect
 10 state ad valorem taxes, county or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational
 11 purposes, or municipal ad valorem taxes for municipal purposes. The homestead exemption
 12 granted by this Act shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any other homestead exemption
 13 applicable to Greene County ad valorem taxes for county purposes.

14 (f) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall apply to all taxable years
 15 beginning on or after January 1, 2003.

16 **SECTION 2.**

17 Unless prohibited by the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, the election
 18 superintendent of Greene County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this
 19 section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of Greene County for approval
 20 or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on the third Tuesday in
 21 March, 2003, and shall issue the call and conduct that election as provided by general law.
 22 The superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to be published once a
 23 week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof in the official organ of Greene
 24 County. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon the words:

25 "() YES Shall the Act be approved which provides a new homestead exemption from
 26 Greene County ad valorem taxes for county purposes in the amount of
 27 () NO \$8,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for residents of that
 28 county who are 65 years of age or over?"

29 All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and those persons
 30 desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes
 31 cast on such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full
 32 force and effect on January 1, 2003. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not
 33 conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective and
 34 this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following
 35 that election date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Greene County. It shall
 36 be the election superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.

1 **SECTION 3.**

2 Except as otherwise provided in Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
3 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

4 **SECTION 4.**

5 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
