## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 34 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 motor vehicle accident reparations, so as to repeal certain provisions relating to vehicles not
- 3 to be licensed until proof of insurance is furnished; to amend Code Section 40-2-26 of the
- 4 Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to form and contents of application for
- 5 registration and heavy vehicle tax, so as to change certain provisions relating to vehicles not
- 6 to be registered unless proof of insurance is furnished; to provide effective dates; to repeal
- 7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Chapter 34 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicle
- accident reparations, is amended by striking and reserving Code Section 33-34-5, relating to
- vehicles not to be licensed until proof of insurance is furnished.
- 13 SECTION 2.
- 14 Code Section 40-2-26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to form and
- 15 contents of application for registration and heavy vehicle tax, is amended by striking
- subsection (d) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
- 17 "(d) On and after February 1, 2003, no vehicle registration or renewal thereof shall be
- issued to any motor vehicle if:
- 19 (1) If the vehicle registration thereof has been revoked, suspended, or canceled; and
- 20 unless
- 21 (2) Unless the owner of the motor vehicle provides satisfactory proof that the motor
- vehicle is subject to a policy of insurance that provides the minimum motor vehicle
- insurance coverage required by Chapter 34 of Title 33 or an approved self-insurance plan,
- 24 and the records of the department reflect that such coverage is in effect pursuant to notice
- 25 provided in accordance with Code Section 40-5-71 or, in the absence of such notice, the

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county tag agent or the authorized designee thereof has obtained written proof from the
insurer or insurer's agent that such coverage is in effect, and in the case of a private

passenger vehicle that such coverage was initially issued for a minimum term of six

months; provided, however, that the owner's inability to register or renew the registration
of any motor vehicle due to lack of proof of insurance shall not excuse or defer the timely
payment of ad valorem taxes due and payable upon said vehicle. The owner shall submit
such proof in accordance with the requirements of Code Section 40-6-10."

8 SECTION 3.

- 9 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 10 without such approval or on February 1, 2003, whichever last occurs.

## SECTION 4.

12 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
