

Senate Bill 46

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 4 of Chapter 21 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to the Peace Officer and Prosecutor Training Fund, so as to provide that such fund
3 shall be used solely for peace officer and prosecutor training; to provide for an accounting
4 of receipts and appropriations; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

7 Article 4 of Chapter 21 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
8 Peace Officer and Prosecutor Training Fund, is amended by striking in its entirety Code
9 Section 15-21-77, relating to collections to be appropriated for law enforcement or
10 prosecutorial officers' training, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

11 "15-21-77.

12 An amount equal to all funds remitted as provided in Code Section 15-21-74 in the
13 immediately preceding year shall be appropriated solely to fund law enforcement or
14 prosecutorial officers' training, or both, and activities incident thereto, ~~including, but not~~
15 ~~limited to, payment or repayment to the state treasury for capital outlay, general obligation~~
16 ~~bond debt service, administrative expenses, and any other expense or fund application~~
17 ~~which the General Assembly may deem appropriate.~~ This Code section shall not preclude
18 the appropriation of a greater amount for this purpose."

19 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 2.**

20 Said article is further amended by inserting at the end thereof the following:

21 "15-21-78.

22 The director of the Office of Planning and Budget shall at the close of each fiscal year
23 prepare an accounting of all deposits made by the commissioner of revenue pursuant to
24 Code Section 15-21-74 and all appropriations of all such funds."

SECTION 3.

2 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
