## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing Community Health Centers Day and inviting designated representatives of the
- 2 community health centers to appear before the House of Representatives; and for other
- 3 purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, a large portion of the state's residents reside in federally designated medically
- 5 underserved areas and do not have access to affordable, quality health care services; and
- 6 WHEREAS, nearly 1.4 million people in the state are currently uninsured, most of whom are
- 7 the working poor who cannot pay the high cost of health care, and numerous others are
- 8 underinsured; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Georgia has significant disparities in health care outcomes in racial and ethnic
- 10 minority groups, including wide differences in average life span, infant mortality, cancer
- screening and management, cardiovascular disease, asthma, diabetes, HIV infection/AIDS,
- 12 and immunizations; and
- 13 WHEREAS, access to comprehensive primary health care services without regard to income,
- 14 cultural or ethnic heritage, or disease conditions has been shown to be most effective in
- 15 improving the health of all people; and
- 16 WHEREAS, federally funded community health centers are located in 71 of the state's
- 17 underserved communities and provide primary and preventive health care for over 179,000
- 18 persons, including the working poor, uninsured, underinsured, elderly, homeless, immigrants,
- 19 and other vulnerable populations; and
- 20 WHEREAS, the community health centers offer access to a wide range of cost effective
- 21 primary and preventive medical and dental services and prescription medicines as well as
- 22 health education, nutrition counseling, translation, community outreach, transportation, and
- 23 support programs without regard to the patient's ability to pay; and

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1 WHEREAS, the health centers have a track record of over three decades of controlling costs,

- 2 providing quality care, recruiting and retaining excellent health professionals where they are
- 3 most needed, and empowering communities to develop long range solutions to their health
- 4 care needs while removing economic, cultural, geographic, and other barriers to adequate
- 5 health care; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the health centers, which bring over 23 million federal dollars per year to
- 7 Georgia communities, provide a major safety net and help to keep families from falling into
- 8 poverty while creating jobs and generating economic activity in the economically depressed
- 9 communities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the cost effectiveness of community health centers has been documented in
- several studies that show that rates of emergency room visits and hospitalization are much
- 12 lower among health care patients than patients of other providers and that community health
- 13 centers cost Georgia's Medicaid program at least 20 percent less than similar providers of
- 14 primary health care; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the community health centers work in partnership with other health providers,
- local hospitals, health departments, social service agencies, and health related supportive
- 17 services to maximize resources and assure that services are coordinated to improve the health
- 18 status of the community; and
- 19 WHEREAS, President George W. Bush has made expansion of community health centers
- 20 to 1,200 new communities nationwide a hallmark of his health care agenda and has proposed
- 21 doubling the federal investment in health centers over a five-year period, providing the
- 22 opportunity for expansion of health center services in Georgia; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Georgia's community health centers and their state organization, the Georgia
- 24 Association for Primary Health Care, support the President's expansion goals and have taken
- 25 a leadership role in helping to resolve the state's health care access problems, assure
- 26 continuous quality improvement, and reduce health care disparities among the underserved
- 27 through participation in the national health disparity collaboratives; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the community health centers deserve commendation for their outstanding
- 29 record of service and dedication to improving the health care and health status of all
- 30 Georgians.

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1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that

- 2 the members of this body recognize February 4, 2003, as Community Health Centers Day.
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that designated representatives of the community health
- 4 centers are invited to appear before the House of Representatives on such date and time as
- 5 designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 7 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia Association for
- 8 Primary Health Care.
