A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 13 of Title 9 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 executions and judicial sales, so as to provide for limitation of damages in civil actions by
- 3 successful bidders for property sold in certain judicial and certain nonjudicial sales that are
- 4 later rescinded; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 13 of Title 9 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to executions and
- 9 judicial sales, is amended by inserting a new Code section to be designated Code Section
- 10 9-13-172.1 to read as follows:
- 11 "9-13-172.1.
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, 'eligible sale' means a sale that was subsequently
- rescinded by the seller within 90 days after such sale, and that is a judicial sale or a
- nonjudicial sale that was conducted in the usual manner of sheriff's sales.
- 15 (b) In a civil action brought by a plaintiff who was a successful bidder at an eligible sale
- rescinded by the seller due to the automatic stay following a bankruptcy filing by a person
- 17 with an interest in the property, the only damages that may be awarded are bid funds
- tendered at the sale by the successful bidder.
- 19 (c) Damages that may be awarded in a civil action by a plaintiff who was the successful
- bidder at an eligible sale rescinded by the seller shall be limited as provided in subsections
- 21 (d) and (e) of this Code section when the sale was rescinded following a determination of
- one or more of the following circumstances:
- 23 (1) The statutory requirements for the sale were not fulfilled;
- 24 (2) The default leading to the sale was cured prior to the sale; or
- 25 (3) Prior to the sale, the plaintiff in execution and the defendant in execution agreed to
- cancel the sale based upon a promise by the defendant in execution to cure the default.

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1 (d) Damages that may be awarded to a plaintiff in a civil action that fulfills the

- 2 requirements of subsection (c) of this Code section are:
- 3 (1) Bid funds tendered at the sale, plus interest on such funds at the rate of 10 percent
- 4 annually, applied daily;
- 5 (2) Funds paid for insurance on the property or court costs for obtaining possession of
- 6 the property, provided that such funds were paid after the sale and before the successful
- 7 bidder was first notified that the sale was rescinded; and
- 8 (3) Funds paid for maintenance or repair of the property, provided that such funds were
- 9 paid after delivery of the property deed to the successful bidder and before the successful
- bidder was first notified that the sale was rescinded.
- 11 (e) Damages that may not be awarded to a plaintiff in a civil action that fulfills the
- requirements of subsection (c) of this Code section are:
- 13 (1) Specific performance; and
- 14 (2) Lost profit."

SECTION 2.

16 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
