9 Tea Room which was a popular spot for locals that enjoyed an excellent reputation; and

10 WHEREAS, she had a marvelous voice and a special gift for music and she directed the

11 various choirs at Campbell Chapel A.M.E. Church where she was the founder and mentor

12 of the Vivian Bryant Angel Choir which she regarded as her crowning achievement; and

WHEREAS, she was a member of the Modern Matrons, The Senior Dunbar, and the
Campbell Chapel Senior Citizens Club and her community service will be long remembered
by her many associates and the wide circle of friends who valued her deeply.
