1 Expressing regret at the loss of Clarke W. Duncan; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, Clarke W. Duncan will be long remembered as a very dedicated and 3 distinguished businessman and civic leader who contributed substantially to his native 4 community of Buena Vista and Marion County as well as to the State of Georgia; and

5 WHEREAS, he was born on March 14, 1914, attended local public schools and the 6 University of Georgia where, as an alumnus, he was a member of Sphinx, the Gridiron Secret 7 Society, and the Heritage Society in recognition of his campus leadership and academic 8 ability; and

9 WHEREAS, in 1934, he became a clerk at the Buena Vista Loan and Savings Bank and in
10 1942, he was named bank president, one of the youngest in the state at that time; and

WHEREAS, he served as chairman of the Marion County Board of Education for 12 years and as chairman of the finance committee of the Buena Vista United Methodist Church for more than 40 years; and at the state level, he was president of the Association County Commissioners of Georgia, was appointed to the State Board of Education for 10 years, and then elected to the State Highway Board for 12 years; and

WHEREAS, in addition, he was chairman and executive committee member of Magnolia Manor, the South Georgia Home for Aging, Inc., Americus for over 30 years, director of CNL Financial Corp. and Cherokee Life Insurance Company in Macon, and a member of the Big Eddy Club in Columbus; and he was a loving partner to his charming wife, Sue Benson of Mobile, Alabama, with whom he had the honor of raising two fine daughters, Kathy and Susan.
