A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring Dr. Paul Scott; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, Dr. Paul Scott began his distinguished career in education as a high school
3 teacher in 1959 and has effectively served the students and schools of this state as a high
4 school counselor, vocational technical school administrator, director of occupational research
5 for the State Department of Education, associate professor at the University of Georgia, and
6 President of Altamaha Technical College; and

7 WHEREAS, his vast experience as an educator, genuine interest in students who are seeking
8 vocational and technical training, and steadfast dedication to the college have illuminated his
9 many achievements in more than 14 years as President of Altamaha Technical College; and

10 WHEREAS, many honors have been bestowed on Dr. Scott in recognition of his excellence
11 as an educator, editor, researcher, grant writer, administrator, and leader in professional
12 organizations, including the 1987 Kappa Delta Pi, Beta Kappa Chapter Award for Excellence
13 in Teacher Education, a bronze plaque for services rendered to the National Vocational
14 Guidance Association, election to Who's Who in the South and Southwest, invitations to
15 write chapters for the American Vocational Association Yearbook, competitive selection of
16 his dissertation as one of five in the nation for presentation to the American Vocational
17 Education Research Association's National Convention, and Star Teacher Award; and

18 WHEREAS, it is appropriate that we honor Dr. Paul Scott for his many valuable
19 contributions to education in this state.
