A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 20-2-211 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 annual contracts, disqualifying acts, job descriptions, fingerprinting, and criminal record
- 3 checks, so as to change the date for tendering contracts for the ensuing year to school
- 4 principals and for notice that a school principal intends not to accept employment for the
- 5 ensuing school year; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 6 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 Code Section 20-2-211 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to annual

contracts, disqualifying acts, job descriptions, fingerprinting, and criminal record checks, is

amended by striking subsection (b) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

12 "(b) Any other provisions of this article or any other laws to the contrary notwithstanding,

each local governing board shall, by not later than April 15 of the current school year,

tender a new contract for the ensuing school year to each teacher and other professional

employee certificated by the Professional Standards Commission, excluding school

principals, on the payroll of the local unit of administration at the beginning of the current

school year, except those who have resigned or who have been terminated as provided in

Part 7 of Article 17 of this chapter, or shall notify in writing each such teacher or other

certificated professional employee of the intention of not renewing his or her contract for

the ensuing school year. Upon request, a written explanation for failure to renew such

contract shall be made available to such certificated personnel by the executive officer.

When such notice of intended termination has not been given by April 15, the employment

of such teacher or other certificated professional employee, excluding school principals,

shall be continued for the ensuing school year unless the teacher or certificated professional

employee, excluding school principals, elects not to accept such employment by notifying

the local governing board or executive officer in writing not later than May 1.

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(b.1) Any other provisions of this article or any other laws to the contrary notwithstanding, each local governing board shall, by not later than June 1 of the current school year, tender 3 a new contract for the ensuing school year to each school principal on the payroll of the 4 local unit of administration at the beginning of the current school year, except those who 5 have resigned or who have been terminated as provided in Part 7 of Article 17 of this 6 chapter, or shall notify in writing each such school principal of the intention of not 7 renewing his or her contract for the ensuing school year. Upon request, a written explanation for the failure to renew such contract shall be made available to a school 8 9 principal by the executive officer. When such notice of intended termination has not been 10 given by June 1, the employment of a school principal shall be continued for the ensuing school year unless the school principal elects not to accept such employment by notifying the local governing board or executive officer in writing not later than June 15." 12

13 **SECTION 2.**

- 14 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 15 without such approval.

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16 **SECTION 3.**

17 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
