A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 16-11-61 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 peeping Toms, so as to expand the description of the crime; to provide for related matters;
- 3 to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 **SECTION 1.** Code Section 16-11-61 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to peeping Toms, 6 7 is amended by striking the Code section and inserting in lieu thereof the following: 8 "16-11-61. 9 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to be a 'peeping Tom' peep or otherwise observe by 10 any means not authorized by this part, including, but not limited to, observing through 11 windows, doors, openings, or other similar places on or about the premises of another for 12 the purpose of spying upon or invading the privacy of another person or to go about or 13 upon the premises of another for the purpose of becoming a 'peeping Tom.' violating this 14 Code section. It shall also be unlawful for any person to observe by any means, including, but not limited to, a telescope, binoculars, camera, motion picture camera, camcorder, or 15 16 record by electronic means, a person who in the interior of an area in which the occupant 17 has a reasonable expectation of privacy, with the intent to invade the privacy of a person or persons inside. This subsection shall not apply to those areas of a private business used 18 19 to count currency or other negotiable instruments. 20 (b) As used in this Code section, the term 'peeping Tom' means a person who peeps 21 through windows or doors, or other like places, on or about the premises of another for the

- through windows or doors, or other like places, on or about the premises of another for the purpose of spying upon or invading the privacy of the persons spied upon and the doing of any other acts of a similar nature which invade the privacy of such persons <u>It shall be</u>
- 24 <u>unlawful for any person to attempt or conspire to violate this Code section.</u>"
